 - i. One-Stop (GPS)
 - 1. Idea was to hire folks called navigators to work and deal with students and support with registrar and bursar questions
 - 2. Made decision to move academic office to Campus Commons
 - 3. Questions about registrar, financial aid, and bursar's office can be answered here

 - i. Testing a chat bot
 - ii. Getting text from UNC that assists students with questions after admission to UNC
 - 1. Directs students to website links, etc.
 - iii. Introducing this
 - iv. Will monitor usage rate, accuracy of answers, etc.
 - v. If a student makes an inquiry to the chat bot during hours or after hours and needs to speak to a real person, the chat bot will direct the student to the proper phone number
